Luke 22:54–71

⁵⁴Then seizing him, they led him away and took him into the house of the high priest. Peter followed at a distance. ⁵⁵And when some there had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and had sat down together, Peter sat down with them. ⁵⁶A servant girl saw him seated there in the firelight. She looked closely at him and said, “This man was with him.”

⁵⁷But he denied it. “Woman, I don’t know him,” he said.

⁵⁸A little later someone else saw him and said, “You also are one of them.”

“Man, I am not!” Peter replied.

⁵⁹About an hour later another asserted, “Certainly this fellow was with him, for he is a Galilean.”

⁶⁰Peter replied, “Man, I don’t know what you’re talking about!” Just as he was speaking, the rooster crowed. ⁶¹The Lord turned and looked straight at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word the Lord had spoken to him: “Before the rooster crows today, you will disown me three times.” ⁶²And he went outside and wept bitterly.

⁶³The men who were guarding Jesus began mocking and beating him. ⁶⁴They blindfolded him and demanded, “Prophecy! Who hit you?” ⁶⁵And they said many other insulting things to him.

⁶⁶At daybreak the council of the elders of the people, both the chief priests and the teachers of the law, met together, and Jesus was led before them. ⁶⁷“If you are the Messiah,” they said, “tell us.”

Jesus answered, “If I tell you, you will not believe me, ⁶⁸and if I asked you, you would not answer. ⁶⁹But from now on, the Son of Man will be seated at the right hand of the mighty God.”

⁷⁰They all asked, “Are you then the Son of God?”

He replied, “You say that I am.”

⁷¹Then they said, “Why do we need any more testimony? We have heard it from his own lips.”

- 1 From depths of woe, Lord God, I cry;

- 4 If it delays into the night
or waits until tomorrow,
my heart will lean on God's great might,
discarding doubt and sorrow.
The Spirit of the Lord is near,
providing strength to persevere;
depend on God to help you!
- 5 Although our sin is great indeed,
the grace of God is greater;
no loss we suffer can exceed
the help of our Creator.
Our shepherd good and true is he,
who will at last his people free
from all their sin and sorrow.

CW 558 sts. 1,3-6

- 1 Salvation unto us has come by God's free grace and favor;
good works cannot avert our doom, they help and save us never.
Faith looks to Jesus Christ alone, who did for all the world atone;
he is our one Redeemer.
- 3 It was a false, misleading dream that God his law had given
that sinners could themselves redeem and by their works gain heaven.
The law is but a mirror bright to bring the inbred sin to light
that lurks within our nature.
- 4 From sin our flesh could not abstain, sin held its sway unceasing;
the task was useless and in vain, our guilt was e'er increasing.
None can remove sin's poisoned dart or purify our wicked heart,
so deep is our corruption.
- 5 Yet as the law must be fulfilled or we must die despairing,
Christ came and has God's anger stilled, our human nature sharing.
He has for us the law obeyed and thus the Father's vengeance stayed
which over us impended.
- 6 Since Christ has full atonement made and brought to us salvation,
each Christian therefore may be glad and build on this foundation.
Your grace alone, dear Lord, I plead, your death is now my life
indeed, for you have paid my ransom.
