Today is the Third Sunday in Advent as we use our time in the Lord's house to prepare our hearts for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. In our service today we continue our special theme for this first season of the Church Year: ***Be Born in Us Today***. Today's worship order, hymns, prayers, and Scripture readings emphasize how the Holy One from God would be born into this world to bring renewal to all the faint and weary. Christ's birth at Christmas - and his birth in our hearts daily (we call that "faith") - restores our strength so that we might serve him with our lives. May the Lord bless your worship and renew and refresh your spirit within you!

We see the second candle on the Advent wreath lit to celebrate the renewal of our lives through faith in Christ Jesus. The apostle Paul writes, We were buried therefore with Christ by baptism into death, in order that, just as he was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life (Romans 6:4).

Holy Child of Bethlehem, be born in us today. You were born among us to bring us new life.

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect (Romans 12:2).

Holy Child of Bethlehem, be born in us today. Renew our hearts and minds in the power of the Holy Spirit so that we might love and serve you by loving and serving others.

Instead of following your will, we seek to conform our lives to the world's temptations. Have mercy on us and forgive us. Renew and restore us.

God had mercy on us and sent his Son to be our Savior. Jesus took our sins upon himself and suffered and died on the cross to pay for them. Therefore, I announce to you that your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen! Help us, Lord, to live in newness of life. Lead us to seek your will so that we might do what is good, acceptable and perfect in your sight.

God gives his people strength

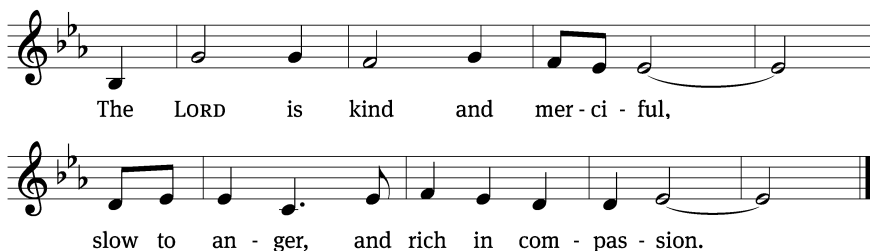
²¹Do you not know? Have you not heard? Has it not been declared to you from the beginning? Have you not understood it from the founding of the earth? ²²He is the one who sits above the circle of the earth. To him its inhabitants are like grasshoppers. He stretches out the heavens like a curtain, and he spreads them out like a tent to live in. ²³He is the one who reduces dignitaries to nothing. He makes the judges of the world useless. ²⁴They have hardly been planted. They have hardly been sown. Their stem has hardly taken root in the earth. Then he blows on them, and they dry up. A driving storm carries them away like chaff.

²⁵To whom can you compare me as if we were equals? says the Holy One. ²⁶Lift up your eyes to the heavens, and see who created these things. See who brings out their army in great number and calls them all by name. Because of his great strength and mighty power, not one of them is missing. ²⁷Why do you speak, O Jacob? O Israel, why do you say, “My way is hidden from the LORD, and justice for me is ignored by my God”? ²⁸Do you not know? Have you not heard? The LORD is the eternal God. He is the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired, and he will not become weary. No one can find a limit to his understanding. ²⁹He is the one who gives strength to the weak, and he increases the strength of those who lack power. ³⁰Young men grow tired and become weary. Even strong men stumble and fall. ³¹But those who wait for the LORD will receive new strength. They will lift up their wings and soar like eagles. They will run and not become weary. 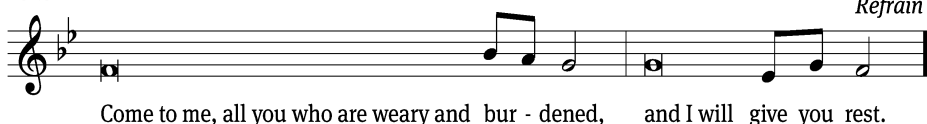

Matthew 1:18–25

The birth of Jesus to bring renewal and life

¹⁸This is how the birth of Jesus Christ took place. His mother, Mary, was pledged in marriage to Joseph. Before they came together, she was found to be with child by the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹Joseph, her husband, was a righteous man and did not want to disgrace her. So he decided to divorce her privately. ²⁰But as he was considering these things, an angel of the Lord suddenly appeared to him in a dream and said, “Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.”

²²All this happened to fulfill what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet: ²³“Look, the virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son. And they will name him Immanuel,” which means, “God with us.”
²⁴When Joseph woke up from his sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him. He took Mary home as his wife, ²⁵but he was not intimate with her until she gave birth to her firstborn son. And he named him Jesus.

Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father.
