FIRST LESSON

Isaiah 52:7-10 All will see the salvation of our God

⁷ How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of a herald, who proclaims peace and preaches good news, who proclaims salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God is king!" ⁸ The voice of your watchmen—they lift up their voices. Together they shout for joy, because with both eyes they will see it when the LORD returns to Zion. ⁹ Break out, shout for joy together, you ruins of Jerusalem, because the LORD is comforting his people. He is redeeming Jerusalem. ¹⁰ The Lord lays bare his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth will see the salvation from our God.

SECOND LESSON

1 In the past, God spoke to our forefathers by the prophets at many times and in many ways. ² In these last days, he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe. ³ The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact imprint of the divine nature. He sustains all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he took his seat at the right hand of the Majesty on high. ⁴ The Son became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

⁵ For to which of the angels did God ever say:

"You are my Son. Today I have begotten you" (Psalm 2:7)

And again:

"I will be his Father, and he will be my Son." (2 Samuel 7:14; 1 Chronicles 17:13)

⁶ And again, when he brought his firstborn into the world, he said: "Let all God's angels worship him." (Deuteronomy 32:43)

⁷ About the angels he says:

"He makes his messengers winds and his ministers blazing fire." (Psalm 104:4)

⁸ But about the Son he says:

Your throne, O God, is forever and ever. The scepter of your kingdom is a scepter of justice. You love righteousness and hate wickedness. Therefore God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of joy more than any of your companions. (Psalm 45:6-7)

John 1:1-14 The Word (Jesus) becomes flesh

¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him everything was made, and without him not one thing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and the life was the light of mankind. ⁵ The light is shining in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

⁶ There was a man, sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷ He came as an eyewitness to testify about the light so that everyone would believe through him. ⁸ He was not the light, but he came to testify about the light.

⁹ The real light that shines on everyone was coming into the world. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not recognize him. ¹¹ He came to what was his own, yet his own people did not accept him. ¹² But to all who did receive him, to those who believe in his name, he gave the right to become children of God. ¹³ They were born, not of blood, or of the desire of the flesh, or of a husband's will, but born of God.

¹⁴ The Word became flesh and dwelled among us. We have seen his glory, the glory he has as the only-begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.
