²²When the time came for the purification rites required by the Law of Moses, Joseph and Mary took him to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³(as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male is to be consecrated to the Lord"), ²⁴and to offer a sacrifice in keeping with what is said in the Law of the Lord: "a pair of doves or two young pigeons."

²⁵Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him. ²⁶It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. ²⁷Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, ²⁸Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying:

²⁹"Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you may now dismiss your servant in peace.

³⁰For my eyes have seen your salvation, ³¹which you have prepared in the sight of all nations:

³²a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel."

³³The child's father and mother marveled at what was said about him. ³⁴Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, ³⁵so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too."

³⁶There was also a prophet, Anna, the daughter of Penuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old; she had lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, ³⁷and then was a widow until she was eightyfour. She never left the temple but worshiped night and day, fasting and praying. ³⁸Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem.

³⁹When Joseph and Mary had done everything required by the Law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee to their own town of Nazareth. ⁴⁰And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was on him.

The peace of the Lord be with you always. **Amen.**



Recap of Dec. 10th Open Forum – Here are some highlights:

- Chairman Travis Kurth read a letter from the leaders of St Peter informing Our Savior's that, at least at this time, a merger of our ministries is not a feasible option.
- Tony Sulko, our congregation's treasurer, gave a financial update. He noted that while Our Savior's is currently holding its own financially during the pastoral vacancy, things would be very different should there be a pastor to support with salary, housing allowance and the necessary benefits. Tony also gave an update on the money that Our Savior's has in checking and savings accounts, as well as in stocks and other special accounts.
- There was discussion about the request of the Church Council that permission be granted to them to be able to spend down our savings in order to financially support having a pastor. It is estimated this could help for up to two years or so.
- There is a need to not only fill the openings on the Church Council but to also have members serving on committee and service groups. Copies will soon be made of Our Savior's by-laws with position and responsibility descriptions. Members are urged to read this information and consider how they can serve. Members of the Church Council in the new year will be reaching out with invitations to help by serving.
- There was discussion about helping our Christian Day School become accredited. This would also enable Our Savior's to enter the school choice program to potentially bring extra financial support.
- Members are encouraged to continue praying for our ministry.
- God willing, another Call meeting for a pastor will be held in mid January.
- There will be a congregational meeting next Sunday, January 7th at 10:10 am.
