

Second Reading

Ephesians 5:21—6:4

²¹Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ.

²²Wives, submit yourselves to your own husbands as you do to the Lord. ²³For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. ²⁴Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything.

²⁵Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her ²⁶to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, ²⁷and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and



Interactive Sermon

Genesis 2:18-24

- How did God lead Adam to notice the conclusion God expressed in verse 18 ("It is not good for the man to be alone.")?
- 2. What does the term suitable helper tell us about the relationship between husband and wife?
- 3. It was God who brought Adam and Eve together and instituted marriage. Marriage, then, is not a human arrangement. What implications does this have for us today?
- 4. Verse 24 gives us a brief description of marriage as instituted by God. What is it?
- 5. In today's gospel, Jesus quoted Moses (2:24) and then added: So they are no longer two, but one. Therefore what God has joined together, let man not separate. What was Jesus saying about God's will for marriage?
- 6. How does God bless marriage?
- 7. What does this account from Genesis 2 tell us about polygamy? Homosexuality? Pre-marital or extramarital sexual relationships?
- 8. Finally, how can single people express appreciation for God's gift of marriage?


WELS Women's Ministry Webinar: "Little Lives with Jesus" Oct. 10, 2024 | 7:00 p.m.

Approximately one in four pregnancies end in miscarriage and that number might be even higher if the loss happens before the mother is aware of her pregnancy. Stillbirths, which occur later in a pregnancy, are far less common but still happen today despite medical advances. Regardless of the frequency of losing a preterm infant, many women report experiencing intense sadness or depression. They feel alone even though they are far from alone.
